			The wearing of some form of face mask covering both the mouth and nose may reduce the risk of the virus being transmitted and spread in groups of people. Do not rush, be patient always stand back and wait for others to pass safely where it is difficult to maintain the 2-metre distance.

			Frequently touched surfaces (door handles, push plates etc) should be thoroughly cleaned and/or sanitised at regular intervals each day.

			Used cloths and tissues should be disposed of responsibly and straight away to reduce the risk of contamination. Sharing of equipment should be discouraged and if unavoidable items should be sanitised beforehand either by using the blue bins as directed or using the sprayer provided. The container doors and pavilion doors should be sanitised with Milton by spraying the surface with solution.

6	Covid – 19 contamination by others/track and trace/briefing	Allowing entry to anyone who may potentially have Covid 19	On arrival, it is expected that the away manager will issue a track and trace form to their Honeybourne Harriers Covid officer (track and trace requires one name and contact number from each household), all visitors will report to a designated "Covid waiting area" as directed by their Covid officer, their Covid officer will temperature check every person using an infrared thermometer, anyone with a temperature of 37.8 degrees or higher will not be permitted to remain, only those on the track and trace form will be permitted to enter the field, it is advisable that while in the waiting area visitors wear a face covering. Signage displayed will show the requirements of entering the pavilion. Surfaces will be wiped with antibacterial wipes on a regular basis, volunteers in the pavilion will wear face coverings and surgical gloves at all times.	Users	L
8	Covid – 19 Parking	Parking to close to one and other thus restricting the social distance requirements	There is ample parking in the main car park, you will be expected to leave a clear car width between each car when parking, if cars are too close, the owners will be required to move their car. 9	Covid – 19 Equipment	Cross contamination from equipment	All play/training equipment will be sprayed, wiped or submerged in antibacterial fluid prior to its use	Users	L



11 Covid	d – 19 first aid	Exposure to external contamination from third party/ first aid administered	It is considered that the first response for first aid should come from a family member or someone from the same bubble as the person injured, however, in cases where there is no family member, the coach/manager should be called to the pitch and administer first aid; in life threatening situations the manager/coach will attend as the official first aider. All manager/coaches have a fully stocked first aid bag with ample surgical gloves and antibacterial spray. If a manager/coach has administered first aid, he/she should seek to wash and sanitise him/herself as soon as practically possible	Player/manager/coaches	M
